The Beginnings of Sunday School

Englishman Robert Raikes, born in 1735, was a Christian layman who was pained to see unschooled children working six days a week in factories or mines. On Sundays, children roamed the streets, often getting into trouble. Most didn't know how to read or write and knew nothing about Christ or the church.

As Raikes labored to reform England's prison system, he noticed that many children were imprisoned, stirring him to action on their behalf. He arranged for halls and homes to be used for educational purposes on Sundays, the one day children didn't have to work. He found volunteers to teach reading, writing and math, as well as the Bible and Christian beliefs.

The first Sunday school class was held in July 1780. Amazingly, by 1788 some 250,000 children were attending such schools. This occurred despite some people's opposition to the education of lower-class children.

Countless boys and girls have attended Sunday school classes since then, thanks to Raikes, who brought Christ's light and love to children around the world.

Sunday School News

We started our new school year on September 18th and celebrated Blessing of the Backpacks. We have two new teachers this year, Cheryl Beauchamp and Jackie Waszkiewicz. We thank them for agreeing to teach our children this year. We also want to thank our returning teachers.

We ask that each family complete a registration form and submit it to one of the teachers. The registration form can be obtained from one of the teachers and is located on the church website, Church School section (http://firstuccrichmond.yolasite.com/church-school.php). The registration form also includes a permission slip for any field trips the Sunday school children may take.

The children are putting together ideas for their mission project. We decided to work with the larger church for Kids Against Hunger. We will be using our noisy offerings collected in July, September, October and November for this cause. We, as a group, will be going to Trinity Lutheran on November 19th to pack meals. Parents are also welcome to join us. Please let us know as soon as possible if you plan to attend.

The children will be going to Kroger on October 30th to finish up last year's mission project - The Richmond Food Pantry. We had so much fun shopping in early spring!

Kids Against Hunger

Another ecumenical, tri-church event happens on Saturday, November 19

Our church members are joining members from Trinity Lutheran and First United Methodist to "stop hunger now." We will help package 10,000, YES, 10,000 nutritional meals from 9am till noon on that Saturday. What a great way to spend a Saturday morning!

There is a shoe (new or used) collection happening along

with the meal packaging. Drop off your shoes at Trinity starting Tuesday morning, November 15 thru Saturday, November 19.

Our church school children have decided that the Noisy Offerings collected from July through November will be donated to the Kids Against Hunger project. Hopefully some of the kids and adults will be on the assembly line packaging these meals.

Press Release Kids Against Hunger conlition of Michigan

An international food relief campaign

....feeding children around world and around the corner...

Kids Against Hunger Coalition of Michigan is partnering with Richmond churches Trinity Lutheran, First United Methodist and First United Church of Christ to "stop hunger now". On Saturday November 19, volunteers of all ages will gather to package over10,000 nutritional meals. The food packing event will take place at Trinity Lutheran Church at 35110 Division (32 Mile Rd.) Richmond 48062 from 9 to approximately 12:30. Volunteers can sign up at www.signupgenius.com for one of the shifts or email Judie at omajudie@yahoo.com. The meals will then be distributed to some of the local food shelters and pantries, as well as disaster relief for areas around the world.

There will also be a shoe collection on that day. Please drop off new or used shoes at Trinity Lutheran Church between 9 am and noon on November 19.

Richard Proudfit, the founder of Kids Against Hunger International, formerly known as Feed my Starving Children, went to Honduras as a volunteer following a devastating hurricane. Profoundly affected by the starvation, malnutrition and deaths seen among the countries children, Proudfit committed his life and financial resources to addressing the enormous problem of world hunger. Kids Against Hunger is a 501c 3 nonprofit organization whose primary purpose is to provide fully nutritious food to the impoverished children around the world and around the corner. Feeding programs in orphanages, schools, shelters, and clinics are the direct paths used to reach and feed starving children. Richard Proudfit saw a need and did something about it by setting up food packaging satellites throughout the United States and Canada. Last year these satellites packaged 50 million meals and distributed the food to starving children in over 50 countries.

In Michigan, the Kids Against Hunger Coalition – State Satellite Headquarters is located in Oak Park. The Michigan affiliate, a partner of Kids Against Hunger International, is lead by Dr. Donald Burwell who established operations in Michigan 1998. In recent months over 75,000 volunteers have packaged nearly 10 million meals, over 3.5 million of these meals have been donated to local food shelter in our State. A million meals were recently shipped to Haiti after the devastating earthquake. KAHC has shipped thousands of meals to countries in Africa, Central America and South America. - * You must re-enroll annually for your points to count for First UCC.
