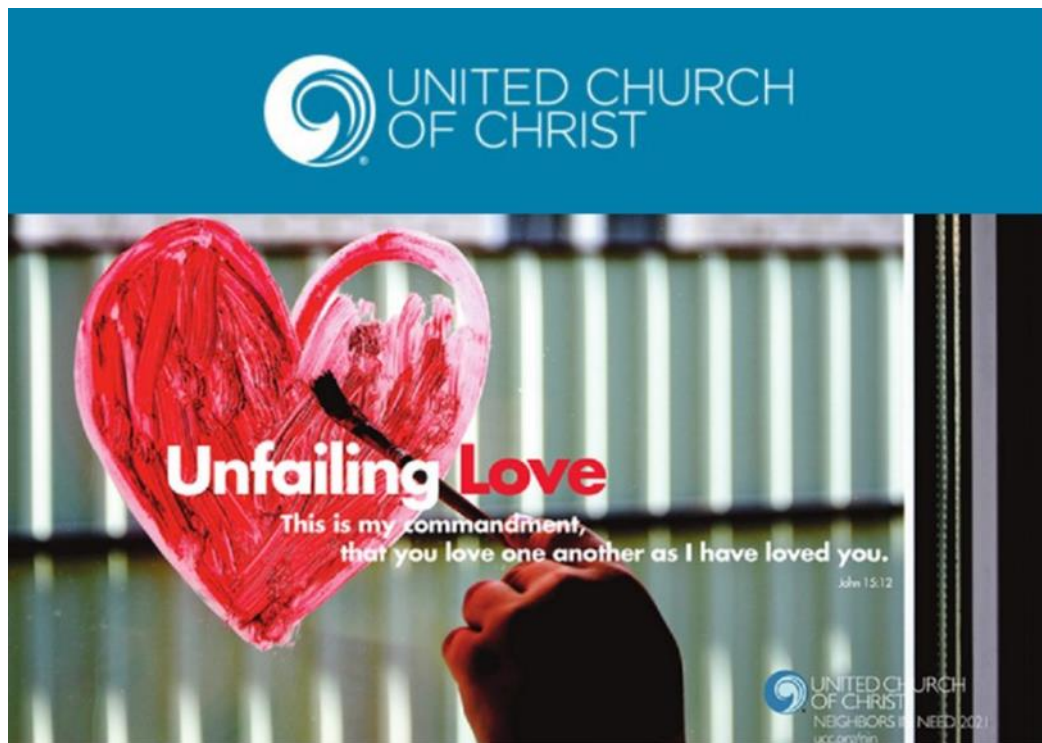

Neighbors in Need Special Mission Offering Sunday, October 3

The 2021 Neighbors in Need “Unfailing Love” offering is focused on supporting organizations and projects serving our homeless and immigrant neighbors and communities. One-third of

NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC’s Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to provide funding grants to UCC churches

and organizations leading justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects in their communities.

can be done at Trinity. If Trinity Lutheran is packaging, the food would need to be at Trinity by 9 am.
