heroism and with gratitude for victory as well as the “opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice.”

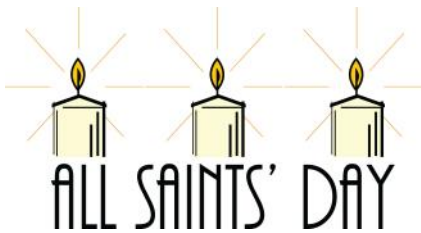

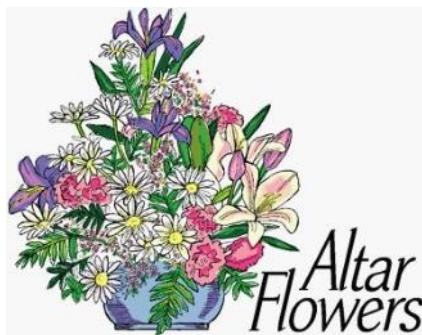


The first of November is All Saints’ Day. During our worship service on **Sunday, October 31**, we will remember those who have gone to God.

Church Council Highlights

The October meeting of the church council included the following highlights:

- ◆ The council approved the purchase of 3 cameras as part of the “Vitality Award” that was received by the church. The cameras will be used to enhance the online service experience.
- ◆ Any member willing to serve on the church council starting next year should let a member of council know.
- ◆ Just as last year, the Christmas dinner will be served to only the police and first responders.
- ◆ Christmas gifts from the church members and friends to the church staff will continue as it has in past years. Look for a mailing from the church in November for more details.
- ◆ The proposal for snow removal by Austin DeBuck was approved.



Once again, we want to share our Christmas blessings with Kids In Distress Services. KIDS is a charity located in St. Clair that provides free clothing to underprivileged and displaced children in the surrounding area. The families in need are referred to this agency. Children, ages infant through 18 years old, receive clothing, age appropriate hygiene products, diapers and baby wipes.

The Mission committee would like you to choose an age and fill a Christmas gift bag with items that you think a child of that age would like to receive. Here is a list of a few suggested items:

- ◆ books
- ◆ small handheld game
- ◆ hat and/or mittens
- ◆ underwear
- ◆ wallet and/or purse
- ◆ gift card

Total value of the gift bag should be between \$25 - \$30. You may also provide

holiday wrapping paper. Please no religious items, candy or food.

The Christmas gift bags need to be brought to church on or before **Sunday, Dec. 5**. You can leave your gifts at the church on a Sunday at the 10 am service or drop them off when the church office is open on Tuesdays, 8:30 am until 12 noon, or Fridays, 8:30 am until 1 pm. This year more than any other year, KIDS needs our help. Please be generous.



What Did the First Thanksgiving Look Like?

The first Thanksgiving, a harvest festival in the fall of 1621, bore little resemblance to what we would recognize as a traditional Thanksgiving today. The event honored a mix of religious, pagan, and practical traditions from past centuries. The pious Pilgrims centered the celebration around Thanksgiving prayers and gratitude to God for their bounty. They also had bonfires, Thanksgiving songs, food and gunshots that got the attention of the Native Americans.

The people from the Wampanoag tribe brought deer, and there was some type of cooked fowl, most likely duck, not turkey. They also ate cranberries, vegetables, cornmeal, and pumpkin—but not in the form of pumpkin pie.

In 1863 President Lincoln declared Thanksgiving an official U.S. holiday celebrated on the last Thursday of November. He hoped that it would help reunite our country fractured by Civil War.

Then, in 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt tried to extend the Christmas shopping season and boost the economy by moving the date of the holiday to the third week of November. Not all states complied. But, by 1942, a proposal was accepted that proclaimed the fourth Thursday in November (which is not always the last Thursday) as Thanksgiving Day.
