Dear Ones,

The wearing of Ashes proudly on Ash Wednesday says "I am a Christian, and I am entering this season with a purpose for my life." Another Season of the Church year has arrived, and I hope that you will make it a season to delve into the meaning of church in your life, the need of ritual, of celebrations, of down time and seeing one another.

You may recall the story of the child in bed crying for his mommy to come and sit with him; she responds, "honey its okay, God is with you." He answers, "but I want God with skin on." Well, that is the importance of being together in person.

Thank you, Price and Mia. You have mastered the production of our worship. And thank you, Price, for your willingness to come in on Thursday evenings for a mini worship for those that can never make a Sunday, but feel the need to be with people in person.

To date, Thursday evenings have been met with snow warnings, but spring is almost here, the days are getting longer, and daylight saving time returns on March 13. All is looking good for some physical fitness at 6:00 pm on Thursday's [walking in place to music and getting the arms into motion] followed by Worship. Coming at 6 o'clock does not mean you are expected to stay for prayer—it is your choice. Again, walking and prayer on Thursday evenings. Any and all are invited.

Our UCC has asked for a FAST for the resolution of the situation in Europe. The first date was February 27, and we need only remember that FAST doesn't have to be about food; it can be about any number of things, but fasting is good for spiritual growth during this season leading up to the great feast of resurrection.

Have you noticed that our Sunday music includes a traditional hymn, a contemporary song, and a theme song? In February, Black History Month, a noted Negro Spiritual song was used every week and stories related to Black history were included within the sermon.

The importance of history was even mentioned when we had the story of Joseph in Egypt. In the book of Genesis, the Pharaoh remembered Joseph, but by Exodus there was no memory of Joseph. Letting history be taught and know is important.

Recall a few years ago. We planted marigold seeds on Ash Wednesday to watch the process of growth, and that growth indicated our spiritual growth. Marigolds germinate fast, so it is within a week to ten days when kids especially can see something happening. By Easter the little plant will be full of green growth, and by Pentecost, flowering. That process is very indicative of how we should grow spiritually. It is a perfect visual for Lent.

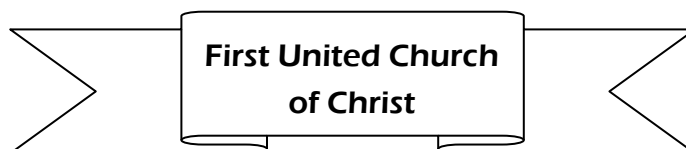
Mark your calendars for April 2, 6:00 pm. Join us for a new fundraiser that will

Church Council Highlights

The February meeting of the church council included the following highlights:

- ◆ It was agreed to include Psalms within the worship services during Lent.
- ◆ For Ash Wednesday, there will be a “drive by” distribution of ashes in the church parking lot from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm.
- ◆ There was a request from the UCC national office to support the Ministers’ Financial Vitality Initiative (MFVI), which is a program that provides support to financially burdened ministers. The MFVI initiative has a goal to raise \$3 million by 2023 and are suggesting that if each church contributed a total of \$1,000 payable over three years, the goal would be met. The council agreed to have one special offering for the MFVI each year for the next three years with the plan to provide a total of \$1000.
- ◆ We will plan to start coffee hour back up after Lent.
- ◆ It was suggested to use the money that we receive from the Kroger community rewards program for a mission. Council selected the Richmond food pantry as the Kroger rewards mission project.
- ◆ The March council meeting will be held on Thursday, March 24th (a week later than normal).
