Dear Ones,

It does my heart good when I visit those in "home away from home" living situations and see cards posted from the membership. Usually, they are placed in a location so as to be seen from a chair or their beds. Life is about change and unforeseen situations, but they are made better by people who care.

Some memories never leave us. Climbing the final steps to the third floor of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in DC, I entered the shoe room of four thousand shoes in the exhibit. The leather still gives off a musty smell that says, We are the shoes, we are the last witnesses, as if to deliver the final crescendo of the Final Solution. In the company of a stranger who was crying, I also began to weep when I saw the baby shoes.

In the Bible, Jesus weeps. He wept in reaction to another and he wept over the disappointment of the broken world. When he wept over Jerusalem it was as if he was crying over human malpractice the world over.

Weeping is an exclusively human behavior because we are the only creation that is struck with the difference between what is and what ought to be. Other animals of creation can whimper and whine, but crying involves the production of tears and we only can do that. However, when a situation throws us into shock, the tears might not come for weeks.

We humans cry happy and sad tears, tears of deep heartache. However they arrive, tears are a biological gift from God. They put us in touch with essential things that we know to be dear or wrong. Those things have a way of taking up residence in our hearts and often draw us closer to God. Giving ourselves permission to cry is valuable especially if we want to trust the psalmist that sowing in tears can reap shouts of joy.

A favorite prophet of many is Jeremiah, and maybe that was precisely because he cried a lot. We have a God who weeps but who also laughs. I think that is what God did on Easter, and that is what we Christians should also do.

Church Council Highlights

The April meeting of the church council included the following highlights:

- ◆ Financially, we were in the red by over \$3,000 for the month of March. This was offset by the Courage Grant of \$2,000 that we received from the conference as well as memorials that were received.
- ◆ The possibility of getting a new laptop to replace the office computer and also be used to stream the Sunday services was presented. The money from the Courage Grant that we received could be used for the purchase along with other items (monitor, router, and lights) to support our streaming of the services.
- ◆ We discussed the usage of memorial monies to replace the carpet in the sanctuary. Council reviewed several alternatives for how much carpet should be replaced. The next step is to receive quotes from several companies.
- ◆ The Armada UCC church is sponsoring MCREST starting the week of May 8. Our church has committed to providing two cakes per day for the week. A signup sheet will be available.
