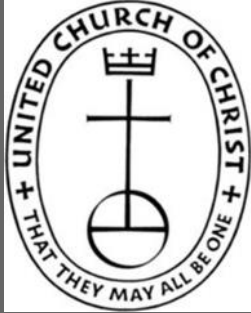

## Our Music Director Shares His Eye-opening Retreat

Hello to the First UCC Richmond Congregation,

I have recently returned from a three-day retreat called the "Great Lakes Pilgrimage" at Echo Grove in Leonard, Mi. When Pastor Dailey learned of my attendance, she knew I would be challenged because I find it difficult to express my faith, and I need to work on it. So, here is my expression of faith related to last weekend:

The retreat forced me to revisit what Christianity can look like here and now. Powerful dramas reminded me that Christ is all around us. It is easy for all of us to forget Christ expects us to live a life that is always resembling and showing His spirituality. Pastor Dailey told me "The retreat will be good for you." She was correct.

The weekend had us listen to many songs, lectures, videos, and testimonials, and the use of a stool was used as an analogy. To stand on a stool, it must have enough legs or it will fall over, and whoever is on it will come toppling down. The legs of Spirituality, Study, Action, and Grace were the name of four of these legs.

One drama hit home regarding Spirituality, so here it is:

A woman walked into her house after a long day at work and was visibly glad to relax. She was ready to watch her favorite show, cook some of her favorite food and drink some wine. However, when she sat down, she was bothered by a knock at the door. It was Jesus. He didn't stop following her. He would follow her all over the house and not rest.

She relegated Jesus to a person that must be placated. She patronized him and asked him to sit down, watch TV and even have some wine saying, "I know you like wine." Finally, she said she was leaving, and Jesus could stay there if He wanted.

As she was leaving, Jesus got up to follow her, and the lady was frustrated, but two more people entered the house. Everyone seemed distraught, and there was crying and pain. The owner of the house told Jesus to "Stand over there!" Jesus stood against the wall with his hands stretched out as if on the cross. His eyes were kind despite his own pain. The people kept Him against the wall by *nailling* Him there. He smiled while on the cross as if a father watching kids on a playground. He obviously loved everyone in the room regardless of each person's demeanor.

As I am watching the drama a young lady came to me and knelt. She handed me a rusty nail and said, "Don't ever forget that Jesus loves you and died for you." She seemed to say this more than once. I felt the power of Christ at that moment more than I have felt it in years. I also felt the urge to be a better Christian, underserving of Grace.

The Pastor who played Jesus, the woman who handed me the nail and the other actors in the Drama, were imbued with the Holy Spirit during the play. The atmosphere they created reminded me of the congregation at First United Church of Christ in Richmond.

I am humbled to be part of your church and create music for worship, and I can do better. Can all of us do better?

Three personal bullet comments I wrote down that need sharing and turned into personal action:

Spirituality: Tell someone I will pray with and for them

Study: Create a modern playlist of Christian Music

Action: Get out of my comfort zone. Be ready to turn a table if needed. Invite friends to church.
