In 1946, a man named Truett Cathy, while running a small diner in Hapeville Georgia called the Dwarf Inn where he served the



workers from the local Ford Motor Plan, discovered that a pressure cooker can cook a piece of chicken just as fast as a hamburger, and *Chick-fil-A* was born. Today Chick-fil-A has grown into one of the largest fast-food restaurants in the country and operates 2,813 restaurants over 47 states. Truett Cathy was a deeply religious man. That does not make me happy, but I'm sure they have their reasons.

Recently, I went into *Chick-fil-A* to order my *Chick-fil-A* sandwich with extra pickles, and they asked my name. It's what they do. So, I said, "My name is Katie Dailey," and right behind me a woman standing in line said, "I thought that was you. I watch you every Sunday." That was nice. And for that I am grateful. Thank you.

### **Church Council Highlights**

The September meeting of the church council included the following highlights:

- Through August, we had a budgeted deficit of \$10,917, but our actual deficit was \$2,578.
- The church received a notification that we will be receiving \$2,000 from the Bertha C. Dayton grant to cover the increased snow removal costs due to price increases and including the clearing of the sidewalks.
- Feedback from the initial budget planning meeting of the Finance committee was shared with the council. Council provided feedback that a line item for an online ministry assistant should be included in the budget. Compensation increases should also be considered based upon input from the personnel committee.
- The tree in the yard next to the church has been removed. It had a branch that had fallen into the church's property. The council recommended sending a letter of thanks to the neighbor for keeping the church informed on the progress of the tree removal, for cleaning up much of the broken branches prior to the tree's removal, and for having the tree removed.
- We will have our annual congregational meeting to review and approve the church's budget for 2024 following the October 8<sup>th</sup> service.

Our Annual Holiday Gift Auction is Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup> following the 10 am service. It will probably start at noon, so everyone has a chance to eat and browse the tables. We will again have it in the Sanctuary as it is easier to get around to see and hear.


on Christmas morning! Types of items sold are baked goods, handmade décor, handmade clothing items, blankets, toys, etc.

Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice. Neighbors in Need also supports our American Indian neighbors in the UCC. One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S.


